# INSTRUCTIONS TO THE AUTHORS

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"KAVAKA" being the Transactions of the Mycological Society of India, was started in the year 1973 as the official publication of Mycological Society of India at Centre for Advanced Study in Botany, University of Madras, Chennai, Tamil Nadu, India. The word 'Kavaka' represents the Sanskrit name for 'fungus'. It is an International Journal of Mycology, which gets published quarterly in March, June, September, and December by the Editor-in-Chief on behalf of the Mycological Society of India. All the back volumes of the journal published till date are available for free access at <a href="http://www.kavaka.fungiindia.co.in">http://www.fungiindia.co.in</a>. Kavaka publishes peer-reviewed, original articles and reviews on various aspects of mycology and plant pathology including conventional taxonomy, molecular taxonomy, phylogeny, diversity, ecology, physiology, biochemistry, molecular biology, biotechnology, and applied aspects of mycology and plant pathology.

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Authors should refer to the latest issue of Kavaka for the format. The manuscript should be submitted in MS Word format and typed double-spaced. Do not right justify the text. All pages should be numbered and line numbers should be provided individually for each page. Times New Roman typeface having font size 10 should be used throughout. The first paragraph of every heading and subheading should be left-justified, while the other paragraphs should be indented. The following order of the contents should to be maintained while submission of manuscript:

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The first page should provide the title and abstract.

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The title should be concise and relevant. Full names of the authors, including the first and surnames, should preferably be provided. The corresponding author should be indicated with an asterisk.

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Brief concluding remarks from the study must be given following discussion, which should be different than the abstract.

### **ACKNOWLEDGMENTS**

Authors must acknowledge the Institution for the facilities where work has been carried out and the financial support received.

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References should be arranged in alphabetical order by authors' last name in the Reference section. The list of references should include only works that are cited in the text and have been published or accepted for publication. If there are several references by the same author(s), then citations are listed in order by the date of publication. Reference list entries should be alphabetized by the last name of the authors and their initials (the first author, the second author, the third author, and so on). If the same author is present in more than one source, such entries should be listed in chronological order. When two or more publications by the same author are cited in the same year, they should be designated by letters a, b, c in the text and references, e.g., 1970a, 1970b, 1970c. Journal names should be italicised, title-cased and **should not be abbreviated**. Provision of DOI is strongly recommended.
